


MAP AND DIRECTIONS TO THE HOLIDAY INN BIRMINGHAM CITY CENTRE

Nearest station: Birmingham New Street Railway Station is less than 5-minutes from to the hotel. **Walking Directions:** Exit the station via the Southside exit. Cross over at the traffic lights and turn left on Hill Street. The Holiday Inn Birmingham city Centre hotel is approximately 200 metres on the right hand side. For the Radisson Blu hotel, pass the hotel and turn right onto Smallbrook Queensway and the hotel is approximately 100 metres on the right hand side.

Nearest Airport: Birmingham International is approximately 40 minutes -1 hour by road or 15 minutes by direct rail link to New Street station.

Nearest car park: NCP New Street car park in St Jude's Passage, B5 4AN, behind the hotel. This is a public car park (fees apply).

Driving from the North: Exit the M6 Motorway at junction 6 and follow the signs for the A38 – Birmingham City Centre. This is a 5-lane carriageway. Keep in the right-hand lane following for A38 – Southwest, Inner Ring Road. This will take you through two tunnels (the first named Chad's Queensway, the second named Great Charles St Queensway), before the third tunnel you must take the left-hand lane and join the Suffolk St Queensway A41 City Centre, following signs for New Street Train Station which will bring you to Smallbrook Queensway. Once on Smallbrook Queensway at the first set of Traffic Lights turn left onto Hill Street (the hotel is on the corner) passing the hotel on your left handside taking the first left into Station Street and the next left into St Judes Passage for the NCP Car Park.

Driving from the South West: Exit the M5 motorway at Junction 3 and follow the signs for A456, Hagley Road. You will be travelling along this road for approximately 4 miles through Edgbaston. The end of the A456, Broad Street you will approach a ring road called Paradise Circus. Follow this around in the right hand lane until you approach the 2nd set of traffic lights past the tunnel and take the next exit which is sign posted to New Street Railway Station. This will bring you onto the Suffolk St Queensway, beware of the Bus Lane on the left, follow the road to the end and take the 1st left turn onto Smallbrook Queensway. Turn left immediately at the 1st set of traffic lights into Hill Street; take the 1st left turn into Station Street and the next left turn into St Judes Passage for the NCP car park.

Driving from the South: Exit the M40 onto the M42 heading North, following signposts for the NEC and Birmingham Airport. Exit the M42 at Junction 6 and follow signs for the A45 Birmingham Airport and City Centre. Continue on the A45 for approximately 8 miles; carry on through Sparkhill to Camphill roundabout. Take the first right onto the roundabout, then left off roundabout and keep in the left hand lane. Turn left at the traffic lights onto Bradford Street, Lexus Cars are on the right. Go through Bradford Street with the Wholesale Markets on the right. Take a right into Pershore Street carry on to the start of the Chinese Quarter, and turn left into Ladywell Walk, follow the road round into Hurst Street. Holiday Inn Birmingham City is straight over the traffic lights on Hill Street. The best car park to park in is the NCP Car Park located at the back of the hotel. Proceed over the traffic lights onto Hill Street, past the hotel taking your first left and then your first left onto Station Street and then first left again onto St Judes Passage for the NCP Car Park which is on the right hand side.

The Working parties (closed meetings) will be held at the Radisson Blu hotel Birmingham and this is located at the junction of Smallbrook Queensway and Holloway Circus, shown as WP on the map.
